



### **Total Outlays and Revenues** % of GDP



#### Federal Debt Held by the Public Under CBO's Extended Baseline





113<sup>th</sup> Congress: Lame Duck Session ~16 Days

- Appropriations CR or Omnibus
  - Current Funding Ends December 11
- Tax Extenders expire December 31-- ~\$900 billion 2015-24
  - 55 Provisions that Expired in 2013 Credit for R&E; Deduction for State and Local Sales Tax; Partial Expensing of Investment Properties; Section 179 Expensing; and others.
  - 15 Provisions that will Expire in 2014 American Opportunity Tax Credit; Refundable Child Credit; Earned Income Tax Credit Modifications; and others.
- Terrorism Risk Insurance expires
- Iran Nuclear Interim Agreement expires November 24
- Internet Tax Moratorium expires
- Defense Authorization /Use of Force Authorization





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
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#### Party Polarization 1879-2006 Distance Between the Parties First Dimension
